Confession-The prayer of confession is not a way to induce more shame in our lives, we offer our confession in the confidence that through grace, God has already forgiven us. God's Word assures us: If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. In humility and faith let us confess our sin to God.)
