The Persons Family

One: The light of God's love that shines in Advent is not like a palace where the privileged dwell, or a secret society open only to those who know the password. God's love is warm and welcoming, with room for all.

All: God's love is like a house, inviting us to make ourselves at home in God's presence. Comforting us with grace and challenging us with truth. Reminding us of our belovedness and belonging as children of God.

One: While we desire to live in righteousness with God and peace with our neighbors, fear and anxiety often cause us to put up fences to protect our own sense of safety and security. Yet those same fences can also make us more suspicious of our neighbors and less able to hear God's voice or follow God's ways.

All: The Angel said to Joseph in a dream, "Do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

One: We light the first candle of hope, like a mountain that shapes our view and guides our steps in God's good promises. We light the candle of peace, like a river that washes us anew, making room for the Spirit of God. We light the candle of joy, like the wilderness, God's presence alive and untamed, blossoming into our world, and we light the candle of love, like a house, warm and welcoming, making room for us as God's beloved children.

Scripture

Isaiah 7:10-16

Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, ¹¹ Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. ¹² But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. ¹³ Then Isaiah^[a] said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman^[b] is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel.^[c] ¹⁵ He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to

refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶ For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah^[a] took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' ²² All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

which means, 'God is with us.' ²⁴ When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, ²⁵ but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; ^[b] and he named him Jesus.
